#### From the Pastor's Desk

#### "Thankful Hearts / Generous Hearts"

But finally the craftsmen left their work to meet with Moses. "We have more than enough materials on hand now to complete the job the Lord has given us to do." (Exodus 35:4f)

The number of times the ancient people of Israel came to the Lord bringing their valuables to assist in the building or repair of the temple is intriguing to me. Often times, these moments of generosity followed times of captivity. After the Lord freed the people from their bondage, they responded with thanksgiving and generosity. Other times, the people had incredibly good fortune with crops and/or herds, and they responded with thanksgiving and generosity. Sometimes the temple was in bad disrepair and the people responded with thanksgiving and generosity.

Read those verses again: "But finally the craftsmen left their work to meet with Moses. 'We have more than enough materials on hand now to complete the job the Lord has given us to do." The craftsmen tell Moses they have more than enough. The people had been too generous. In the next verses, Moses tells the people to stop bringing their gifts to the Lord. Imagine your stewardship committee saying, "We're all good! We don't need any more." Thankful hearts lead to generous hearts. American culture moves rather quickly from Halloween to Christmas. The latter is the favorite holiday in the USA and the former is the second most favorite. Decorations switch from jack-o-lanterns, skeletons and monsters to Christmas trees, holiday lights and ornaments in a matter of days. The extremes between these two holidays is not lost on me.

Sandwiched between these two favorite holidays is a favorite of mine: Thanksgiving Day. Initiated by George Washington in 1789, the fourth Thursday of November was set aside as a day for all Americans to render unto Almighty God "sincere and humble thanks for His kind care and protection... and manifold mercies, and the favorable interpositions of His Providence which we experienced in the course and conclusion of the late war – for the great degree of tranquility, union, and plenty, which we have since enjoyed."

Thanksgiving Day is a time for us to render unto Almighty God humble thanks! What are you thankful for this year? How has God blessed you? protected you? filled your life with good things? Take time to meditate on all the good in your life. Perhaps, even write down your blessings. And then offer prayers of thanksgiving to God. The psalmist encourages us to *"Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good! His faithful love* (hesed) *endures forever."* (Ps. 136:1)

On November 24<sup>th</sup>, the Sunday before Thanksgiving Day, we'll have opportunities in our two worship services for people to come forward and offer thanks to God. These offerings are meant to bless the Lord. Psalm 103 begins with the phrase, *"Bless the Lord, O my soul; and all that is within me, bless His holy name."* How often do we think of ourselves blessing God? We often pray for God to bless us, but how often do we seek to bless Him? I am convinced when we praise God – when we offer thanksgiving to Him – we bless Him. To put it simply, we bring a smile to our Heavenly Father's face. And one of the byproducts of us blessing the Lord is that we bless our sisters and brothers in Christ, as well! The great irony of it all is that when we bless the Lord and we bless our sisters and brothers, we are in turn blessed! In fact, rather than asking God to bless us, perhaps we should seek to bless God, and then we'll experience all the blessings we are asking for.

In the past few weeks, several members of our congregation have responded to the current needs of our church with large donations. One of our members has donated \$100,000 to go toward the needed HVAC unit in the sanctuary with two more installments planned for in the next two years. Another member gave \$30,000 to be used wherever the church needed it most. What warmed my heart was the joy with which these individuals have generously given. Like the ancient Israelites, they have given out of a sense of gratitude for God's presence in their lives, for the strong friendships they have in this church family, and from thankful and generous hearts.

I encourage you to participate in worship on Sunday, November 24<sup>th</sup>, and offer words of thanksgiving to God for the good things He has done. I also encourage you to allow your thankful heart to become a generous heart. Offer gifts to the Lord that will support the outstanding ministries that this church provides, and to help update and make the needed repairs to this beautiful property we have dedicated to God's work.



#### **Thanksgiving Baskets**

Every year Community Concerns contributes to the Thanksgiving baskets assembled by the Family Rescue Center in Canoga Park. This year they will be providing food baskets for 613 families in the West San Fernando Valley (which is up from 550 last year). The baskets (boxes) will be assembled on Thursday Nov. 21 and Friday Nov. 22, and picked up by the recipients on Saturday, Nov. 23. Help is needed to assemble the food boxes. Many other organizations also help in this endeavor and it is quite amazing to see the amount of food donated, the number of volunteers assisting, etc. This is a huge undertaking, and MANY hands are needed. So if you are available, able and willing, here is a volunteer opportunity: Thursday, Nov. 21 11AM - 4PM and/or Friday, Nov. 22 (same times): Assist in packing the 613 baskets with donated food so all is ready when the recipients pick up on Saturday. Location: Family Rescue Center, 22103 Vanowen Street, Canoga Park. At this address you will see a church. Drive around the block and enter from the back side. Easy to find. Parking has always been available.

If you can help out on either date, both dates or any part of either day, it would be greatly appreciated. This can be a family event (adults, teens and young adults). You can gather a friend and go or just go on your own. No need to RSVP, just go if you can. If not, there's always next year!

#### Handy Handouts

The Handy Handout bags will be on sale November 10 between services (2 bags for \$5 or 1 bag for \$3). These bags include a non-perishable meal, personal hygiene items, and brochures on resources for homeless people. 
